

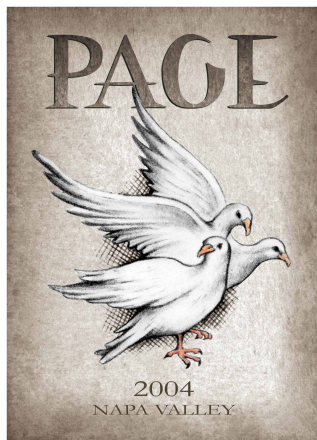
# 2004 PAGE WINE CELLARS

## Proprietary Red

Beginning with the 1997 vintage, I have used Bordeaux varietals from well-established Napa Valley vineyards to create a blend in the style of St. Emilion and Pomerol. As with its French cousins, the wine is made predominantly from Merlot and Cabernet Franc with a brush of Cabernet Sauvignon and Malbec. The result is a wine that not only pays tribute to a grand tradition, but also expresses its own unique character.

This is artisan winemaking at its best; hand-worked and hand-crafted.

### TASTING NOTES

The 2004 Page Blend is a complex blend of some of Napa Valley's finest Cabernet Franc, Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Malbec grapes. The wine has a bold, deep, garnet-hue with the nose revealing brooding black fruit giving way to hints of caramel, cedar and sage. Concentrated and complex, the wine expresses a powerful elegance that is unmatched...

Best enjoyed after decanting over a few hours, the wine seems to live as many, yet acts as one. Each varietal lends to the whole - uplifting each other to a crescendo of harmony. Balanced in flavors and acid, the wine recognizes its lineage to Bordeaux but pays homage to the Napa Valley where it was born. Excellent balance, well-integrated lushness and an exceptionally long finish make the Page 2004 a well sought after wine.
